ABOUT ZAKAAT

Zakāāh expenditures are only for the poor and for the needy and for those employed for it and for bringing hearts together [for Islām] and for freeing captives [or slaves] and for those in debt and for the cause of Allāh and for the [stranded] traveller. An obligation [imposed] by Allāh. And Allāh is Knowing and Wise.

SURAH TAUBAH, 9: 60

HADITH: BUKHARI

Hazrat Abu Hurairah (RA) relates that the Prophet Mohammed (SAW) said whomsoever Allah gives wealth, but who does not pay its Zakaat, his wealth will be likened for him on the resurrection day to a huge bald snake having two fangs, it will bite him round his neck and take hold of him with his two fangs meaning its two jaws and say. I am your wealth and I am your hidden treasure. Then he recited “And let not those who covetously withhold of that which Allah has bestowed on them out of his bounty.”

Zakaat is a compulsory act of worship that requires Muslims who own wealth at or over a certain threshold (called the Nisāb) to donate a portion of their qualifying wealth, typically 2.5%, to eligible recipients. It is a right the poor have over the rich.

The Nisaab was set by the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) at a rate equivalent to 87.48 grams of gold and 612.36 grams of silver, equating to approximately K543,000 (March, 2023). Linguistically, Zakaat carries meanings of purification and growth. The

significance of this pillar is such that in the Quran it is mentioned 28 times in conjunction with the observation of Salāt, the obligatory prayer.

WHEN IS ZAKAAT PAID?

Your Zakaat year starts on the date your wealth first equalled or exceeded the Nisāb. Zakaat is then payable after one lunar year has passed and every year thereafter on that date. Paying Zakaat in Ramadhan is not necessary although giving charity in this month yields greater rewards.

WHO PAYS ZAKAAT?

Those required to pay Zakaat must be:

- i. Adult (have reached puberty)
- ii. Muslim (Zakaat is not paid by non-Muslims)
- iii. Sane
- iv. In possession of the Nisāb

(Please note the three schools of thought other than the Hanafi school consider Zakaat payable on qualifying wealth owned by the insane and children)

WHY ZAKAAT?

Islam encourages employment, entrepreneurial activity, trade and the equitable distribution of wealth. For commerce to benefit society, Islam imposes several obligations on those involved in wealth creation. Amongst these is the obligation of Zakaat, the third of five pillars of Islam.

Scholars infer that the giving of Zakaat has both an outer and an inner dimension. The inner dimension suppresses the ego, quelling tendencies such as selfishness and miserliness. The outer dimension involves the purification of a Muslim's wealth.

WHO RECEIVES ZAKAAT?

The Quran (Chapter 9, verse 60) specifies eight categories for the distribution of Zakaat:

- i. The poor
- ii. The needy
- iii. Those employed to administer Zakaat
- iv. Those whose hearts are to be reconciled
- v. Those in slavery
- vi. Those in debt
- vii. In the way of Allah
- viii. The destitute traveller

IZF relies on the generosity of donors and the faithful practice of Zakaat to make this work possible. IZF deeply appreciates every act of worship, big and small through Zakaat that makes such important work possible.

Local Colleges Students

In 2022 we sponsored 970 students (479 Males & 491 Females) doing different programs and among them 574 students received monthly pocket allowance addition to their full tuition fees.

288 students graduated in december 2022 in different programs.



Farmers Pack

In 2022/1444H, Islamic Zakaat Fund Malawi successfully implemented the Fourth Farmers Pack project in partnership with Dedza Welfare Trust UK. As a result of the global challenges of climate change, economic downturns, and the COVID-19 pandemic, breaking persistent cycles of hunger and malnutrition for families is crucial.

In line with the Mw2026 agenda, we supported 200 families in Machinga and Mangochi Districts. The Farmers Pack contained essential farming inputs for the 2022/2023 farming season, including 25 kg each of UREA and NPK fertilizers, 2Kg maize seeds, 1kg groundnut seeds, 100ml pesticides, and a

heavy-duty hoe.

The beneficiaries of the project were grateful for the support, which came just in time for the planting season. The Farmers Pack was distributed in three locations, Chiponde in Mangochi, Ntaja, and Mkanda village in Machinga. A total of 200 households received the package, with 70 households in Chiponde, 40 households in Ntaja, and 90 households in Mkanda village.

The Fourth Farmers Pack project has proven to be helpful and impactful, providing direct positive effects on the lives of rural people. With food on the table, they can carry out their day-to-day work with a smile.
